There has been a lot of news reported lately on the future changes with the state report card grading system, as well as much more difficulty in passing the various subject tests in the different grade levels. Dr. Stan Heffner, state superintendent has communicated, "this system will be far more rigorous than the one currently, and in general, grades will be lower by one or even two levels from the counterpart rating that we have been using in our current accountability system." He also communicated, "the projections for passing the state test for 2014-15 will drop from the current state averages of 66% to 88% to a projected state average of 25% to 35%." Lebanon's current average is 79% to 99%.

**195** of the total number of schools in the state would have received a **C grade**

**182** of the total number of schools in the state would have received a **D grade**

**99** schools/districts would have received an **F grade**  
(96 are charter schools and 3 are public schools)
